ORDINANCE NO. 2018-58

ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 945.01 OF THE CITY OF GALION CODIFIED ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, Section 945 of the City of Galion Codified Ordinances currently reads as follows:

945.01 RESERVOIRS.

The following regulations shall apply to all reservoirs, and to the lands surrounding these reservoirs owned by the City.

No person shall:

- (a) Injure, remove, deface, damage or destroy any tree, plant, lawn embankment, decoration, poster, sign, building or fence on the premises.
- (b) Disturb, remove, damage, destroy, molest or possess any equipment or property of the City or of the State Division of Wildlife or of any other person, firm, corporation, governmental agency or political subdivision.
- (c) Commit any act by use or operation of any motor vehicle on any of the premises, which act if committed on a public highway or street in the State would be prohibited and unlawful.
- (d) Operate a motor vehicle or permit a motor vehicle to be driven on the lands, except on designated roads and driveways provided for such purposes without first obtaining written permission from the Mayor.
- (e) Dump rubbish, garbage, refuse or debris of any kind upon the lands, except in places and within receptacles provided by the City. No person shall deposit in these places or within these receptacles any rubbish, garbage, refuse or debris accruing from any place or area other than on the aforementioned lands.
- (f) Remove ice, sand, gravel, stone, wood, fruits or other substances from the lands without first obtaining written permission from the Mayor; provided, however, that this provision shall not prevent berry picking, mushroom picking or nut picking.
- (g) On the lands, sell, offer for sale or have in his or its possession with intent to sell or expose for sale, any article of food, frozen dessert, ice cream, imitation ice cream, frozen custard, milk, sherbets, candy, cake, coffee, soda pop, confectionery, jewelry, wearing apparel, motor vehicle, bicycle, watercraft, marine equipment, bait or any other tangible property, without first obtaining the written permission of the Mayor.
- (h) Erect or post on the lands any placard, sign, notice, poster or billboard without the written permission of the Mayor.
- (i) Swim, bathe or wade in the waters of the reservoirs.
- (j) Skate or sled upon or over the ice upon the reservoirs.
- (k) Place, use, operate or permit to be used or operated any boat, raft, canoe, inner tube, float or other similar device in, on or under the waters of the reservoirs except that boats may be placed on and in the water of all reservoirs if operated in accordance with the following regulations:
 - (1) Rowboats, sailboats and canoes shall be permitted on all reservoirs between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. only.
(Ord. 91-5884. Passed 4-9-91.)
 - (2) Sailboats and rowboats shall be limited to fourteen feet in length.

(3) Boats shall be of the type authorized under the laws of the State and must be duly licensed pursuant to the laws of the State.

(4) Boats shall be operated pursuant to the Operation and Safety Laws and rules provided by the State.

(5) Boats must carry lights as provided by the laws of the State.

(6) Boats must be launched and removed from the reservoirs at the places provided for such purposes by the City or the State, and boat ramps must remain clear.

(7) Boats must be removed from the reservoirs and City-owned lands by 11:00 p.m. each day and not be returned before 4:00 a.m. of the next day.

(8) The Mayor is authorized to stop or have stopped the use of all boats on the reservoirs upon the posting of notice thereof if, in his opinion, conditions of safety or sanitation of the reservoirs require the action. Any person using or operating a boat on the reservoirs agrees by usage and/or operation to be subject to the orders and directions of the Mayor.

(9) No person shall place himself in, on or under the waters of the reservoirs. Fishing shall be permitted only from the banks of the reservoirs and from boats in all reservoirs operated in accordance with this subsection (k).

(l) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent ice fishing, fishing through the ice of the reservoirs being hereby expressly permitted.

(m) Erect, install, place or suffer to remain any ice fishing shanty on the ice of the reservoirs or elsewhere on the premises of the reservoirs, other than collapsible shanties which may be used provided they are removed from the premises of the reservoirs prior to closing time each day, and

WHEREAS, Council is desirous of maintaining recreational opportunities on the City's reservoirs while at the same time it recognizes the impact that certain types of uses may have on the facility as well as to the waters and grounds therein, and also to the City's utility system.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF GALION, CRAWFORD COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: That Section 945.01 of the City of Galion Codified Ordinances be changed to read as follows:

945.01 RESERVOIRS.

The following regulations shall apply to all reservoirs, and to the lands surrounding these reservoirs owned by the City.

No person shall:

(a) Injure, remove, deface, damage or destroy any tree, plant, lawn embankment, decoration, poster, sign, building or fence on the premises.

(b) Disturb, remove, damage, destroy, molest or possess any equipment or property of the City or of the State Division of Wildlife or of any other person, firm, corporation, governmental agency or political subdivision.

(c) Commit any act by use or operation of any motor vehicle on any of the premises, which act if committed on a public highway or street in the State would be prohibited and unlawful.

(d) Operate a motor vehicle or permit a motor vehicle to be driven on the lands, except on designated roads and driveways provided for such purposes without first obtaining written permission from the Mayor.

(e) Dump rubbish, garbage, refuse or debris of any kind upon the lands, except in places and within receptacles provided by the City. No person shall deposit in these places or within these receptacles any rubbish, garbage, refuse or debris accruing from any place or area other than on the aforementioned lands.

(f) Remove ice, sand, gravel, stone, wood, fruits or other substances from the lands without first obtaining written permission from the Mayor; provided, however, that this provision shall not prevent berry picking, mushroom picking or nut picking.

(g) On the lands, sell, offer for sale or have in his or its possession with intent to sell or expose for sale, any article of food, frozen dessert, ice cream, imitation ice cream, frozen custard, milk, sherbets, candy, cake, coffee, soda pop, confectionery, jewelry, wearing apparel, motor vehicle, bicycle, watercraft, marine equipment, bait or any other tangible property, without first obtaining the written permission of the Mayor.

(h) Erect or post on the lands any placard, sign, notice, poster or billboard without the written permission of the Mayor.

(i) Swim, bathe or wade in the waters of the reservoirs.

(j) Skate or sled upon or over the ice upon the reservoirs.

(k) Place, use, operate or permit to be used or operated any boat, raft, canoe, inner tube, float or other similar device in, on or under the waters of the reservoirs except that boats may be placed on and in the water of all reservoirs if operated in accordance with the following regulations:

(1) Rowboats, sailboats and canoes shall be permitted on all reservoirs between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. only.

(2) Sailboats and rowboats shall be limited to fourteen feet in length.

(3) Boats shall be of the type authorized under the laws of the State and must be duly licensed pursuant to the laws of the State.

(4) Boats shall be operated pursuant to the Operation and Safety Laws and rules provided by the State.

(5) Boats must carry lights as provided by the laws of the State.

(6) No private sailboat, rowboat, canoe, or any other boat with a gasoline-powered motor shall be on any reservoir.

(7) Boats must be launched and removed from the reservoirs at the places provided for such purposes by the City or the State, and boat ramps must remain clear.

(8) Boats must be removed from the reservoirs and City-owned lands by 11:00 p.m. each day and not be returned before 4:00 a.m. of the next day.

(9) The Mayor is authorized to stop or have stopped the use of all boats on the reservoirs upon the posting of notice thereof if, in his opinion, conditions of safety or sanitation of the reservoirs require the action. Any person using or operating a boat on the reservoirs agrees by usage and/or operation to be subject to the orders and directions of the Mayor.

(10) No person shall place himself in, on or under the waters of the reservoirs. Fishing shall be permitted only from the banks of the reservoirs and from boats in all reservoirs operated in accordance with this subsection (k).

(l) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent ice fishing, fishing through the ice of the reservoirs being hereby expressly permitted.

(m) Erect, install, place or suffer to remain any ice fishing shanty on the ice of the reservoirs or elsewhere on the premises of the reservoirs, other than collapsible shanties which may be used provided they are removed from the premises of the reservoirs prior to closing time each day, and

Section 2: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

Section 3: That this ordinance shall take effect and be enforce from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-64

ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2017-66 (PERMANENT 2018 APPROPRIATIONS) BY APPROPRIATING FROM UNAPPROPRIATED FUNDS IN THE GENERAL FUND AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That Ordinance No. 2017-66 (Permanent 2018 Appropriations) passed December 13, 2017, be, and the same is hereby amended as delineated in the following sections:

Section 2. That Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-7020-52503-General Fund – Mayor –Capital Outlay/ Buildings.

Section 3. The above appropriated funds shall be used for the purchase of property located at 329 and 331 Harding Way East, Galion, Ohio for city purposes.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

Section 5: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Galion and its inhabitants, and in order to make the appropriation adjustments in the Permanent 2018 appropriations without delay to meet pending obligations, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-65

ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY-SERVICE DIRECTOR TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT A LAW ENFORCEMENT BODY ARMOR GRANT MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Attorney General in conjunction with the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation has made grant funds for local law enforcement agencies to purchase body armor vests; and

WHEREAS, the City of Galion wishes to request a grant of said funds in the amount of One Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Six and 50/100 Dollars (\$1,786.50) to be used with the local share of twenty-five percent (25%) being the amount of Five Hundred Ninety-Five and 50/00 Dollars (\$595.50), for a project total of Two Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-Two Dollars (\$2,382.00) to be used for the purchase of body armor vests, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GALION, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: That the Safety-Service Director be, and he is hereby, authorized to execute any and all documents as are necessary to apply for and, if approved, to accept a grant of One Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-Six and 50/100 Dollars (\$1,786.50) to be used with the local share of twenty-five percent (25%) being the amount of Five Hundred Ninety-Five and 50/00 Dollars (\$595.50), for a project total of Two Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-Two Dollars (\$2,382.00) from the Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program in conjunction with the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation for the purchase of 10 body armor vests.

Section 2: That in connection with said Application for the aforementioned funds, this Council understands and intends to provide funding for the City's local share in for the grant

described in Section 1 hereof.

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be published in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 731.21 and 731.22.

Section 4: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Galion and its inhabitants, and in order participate in the program in a timely basis, this measure is determined to be an emergency Ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

Re: Appropriation of Funds in Fund 102

Mr. Watt and Members of City Council,

On September 26, 2018 I presented to the Police, Fire and Health Committee a proposal to apply for, and accept, a grant from the Ohio Attorney General for the purchase of Active Shooter Bulletproof Vests for our officers. This grant would allow for us to purchase 10 Active Shooter Vests to be placed in every vehicle to be used in the event of an Active Shooter incident. These vests are in addition to the bulletproof vests that the officers already wear while on duty.

The grant is a 75/25 % matching grant. The total cost of the vests we would be purchasing is \$2382.00 with the city's cost of \$595.50.

I have already applied for the grant and have been given notice that our department is approved to receive the grant. I am waiting on Council Approval to formally accept the grant from the Ohio Attorney General.

The Police, Fire and Health Committee unanimously approved my recommendation to be forwarded to the entire City Council for approval.

Attorney General DeWine Announces New Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program with the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation

8/14/2018

(COLUMBUS, Ohio)—Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine today announced a plan to create a new program to help Ohio's local law enforcement agencies purchase body armor vests. The Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation has agreed to support funding the effort through a recent expansion of its safety grant program.

The BWC currently offers its Safety Intervention Grant Program to Ohio's private and public employers to purchase equipment to reduce or eliminate injuries and illness associated with a particular task or operation. A portion of the Safety Intervention Grant Program funds will be used to fund the new Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program, enabling local law enforcement agencies to receive up to \$40,000 per agency to purchase body armor vests with a local match of 25 percent.

"I am pleased to be able to offer the new Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program in partnership with the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation to help local law enforcement agencies with the costs associated with life-saving body armor vests," said Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine. "This new program will help our first responders get the latest body armor, helping to protect them while they do the important work of keeping their communities safe."

In June, BWC announced that it would dedicate a portion of safety grants to prevent injuries and fatalities among law enforcement officers. Under an agreement between the Attorney General and BWC, the Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program will be eligible for these funds through June 2019.

Beginning today, Ohio's law enforcement agencies will be able to apply for the program through an application form that will be linked on the Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway (OHLEG). Applications will be reviewed and awarded on a first-come, first served basis. Vests to be purchased must meet the National Institute of Justice (NIJ) standards, and agencies must demonstrate that they have a mandatory wear policy in place for uniformed officers on duty.
